



Great Family Walks in Ipswich



- 1. Ipswich Nature Centre, Queens Park, Goleby Ave, Ipswich**
Find out about our native animals and see live quolls, bilbies, snakes, emus, wombats and more! Enjoy an easy walk and view displays at the free Environmental Education Centre.
- 2. Purga Nature Reserve, 840 Middle Rd, Purga**
Easy, level boardwalks suitable for strollers and wheelchairs lead you through amazing and rare paperbark forest. Keep an eye out for wallabies.
- 3. Haig St Quarry Bushland, 59 High St, Brassall.**
A great place for a family BBQ or picnic with a choice between two great walking trails through the bush.
- 4. Kholo Gardens, 243 Riverside Dr, Muirlea**
It's a nature play paradise and Ipswich's best kept secret! It has short forest trails along a shady creek and access to the Brisbane River where platypus can sometimes be seen.
- 5. Pan Pacific Peace Gardens, 1 Macauliffe St, Redbank**
Check out the water dragons around the lake, the wide variety of birds. You can even spot a flying fox colony.
- 6. White Rock Spring Mt Conservation Estate, School Rd, Redbank Plains**
Explore some great trails to amazing rock features from Paperbark Flats Picnic Area. Why not take your bikes and head out to White Rock itself?
- 7. Harding's Paddock- nestled in Flinders Goolman Conservation Estate**
Harding's Paddock offers a range of bushwalks including a bush tucker trail. Try the Gamlen Circuit early in the morning for great bird watching. You can even camp here!
- 8. Denmark Hill Conservation Park, 2 outridge St, Ipswich**
A short walk from the Ipswich CBD this is a great place for a walk through the bush. Step back to the dinosaur age at Triassic Park, or climb the water tower for great views.
- 9. Walter Zimmerman Park, 6 Kirkston Place, Pine Mountain**
Take a relaxing walk through the bush, and if you would like a longer walk, you can link up with the Brisbane Valley Rail Trail and keep going as far as you want!
- 10. Ric Natrass Environmental Park, 82 Eric St, Goodna.**
It's an oasis in the suburbs and a great place to take the family for a short nature break.
