# TO DO to explore islands in QLD

paddle, sail or catch an island ferry!

1. Make an ancient looking sea chart and bury some treasure for your friends to find.
2. Explore the beaches to find out about the wildlife living on the land, in the water and in the air.
3. Make a flag to use on a fort you can build from driftwood and sand sculptures.
4. Watch how the tide changes by marking the water's edge and coming back to the same spot later.
5. Learn six different sailors knots and use them to lash a raft together.
6. Collect water debris - flotsam and jetsam - to build a sailing boat (and put the rubbish in the bin).
7. Use a compass to see which direction the wind is coming from, and check again later to see if it has changed.
8. Circumnavigate the island by water or land to learn about the windward and leeward side.
9. Swing a lead line to sound the depths and update your sea chart.
10. Share a picnic under the trees before heading home.
