

Nature Loose Parts Wish List

Here is a list of the sort of items that can be used in a loose parts pit. These might seem like unusual play items, but they can be used in endlessly different ways, allowing children to make anything from an obstacle course, to a racing car, palace or cubby!

NATURAL	RECYCLED
Sticks of various sizes	Tyres and inner tubes
Tree stumps	Crates
Longer large logs	Ropes
Stones/rocks, pebbles of varying textures and sizes	Tarps and pegs
Seed pods, cones, nuts	Fabric – curtains, sheets, heshian
Bamboo in whole pieces or sliced in half and hollowed out	Ribbon / wool / string Pipes / hose pipes / flexible hose / PVC pipes
Vine (that has been pruned)	and fittings
Branches / leaves	Funnels
Sand	Guttering
Woodchips, sawdust	Pallets
Feathers	Plant pots
Mud / ochre / dirt / clay	Kitchenware – e.g. pots, pans, cake tins, spoons, sieves
Water	Cardboard boxes and tubes
Dried or fallen flowers	Bricks and blocks
Bark: paperbark or palm sheaves or seed	Tubs and storage containers
hangings	Reels - electrical reels plastic or wooden
Haybales/ straw	Netting
	Baskets
