Nature Play QLD's Education Provider program celebrates and awards recognition for the outstanding work of leaders in nature play and outdoor learning. Through involvement in this program, your school will receive support to further develop your outdoor learning and nature play and your achievements and success will be promoted state-wide.

Demand for nature play and learning outside of the classroom is growing rapidly across Queensland and Nature Play QLD Education Providers are actively being sought-out by parents and carers through our community.

Benefits of becoming a recognised Nature Play QLD Education Provider:

- Be an official 'Education Provider', as recognised and assessed by Nature Play QLD
- Have a personalised Nature Play QLD webpage 'case study' shared online, in our newsletters and via social media to promote and celebrate your practices.
- Be listed in our 'Education Provider' portal, which will be promoted through Nature Play QLD's marketing and promotional channels regularly.
- Receive the 'Official Nature Play QLD Education Provider' logo to use on all service media and documentation.
- Receive an 'Official Nature Play QLD Education Provider' outdoor banner corflute to display at your service.

How much will it cost?

The initial application will incur a one-off fee of \$450 (inc. GST). Approved Nature Play QLD Education Providers will be able to maintain their listing and benefits with fee of \$150 (inc GST) and a reverification process every two years.

Application Process

Are you an eligible Nature Play Education Provider?

Ensure you have read this guide and understand eligibility criteria.

Listing Goes Live

Nature Play QLD will list your services on our Nature Play Education Provider Hub.



Recognition Status

New provider approves listing, marking the completion of the application process.

Once application have been complete Nature Play Education providers will begin to receive the benefits of all Nature Play Education providers including promotion, and helpful correspondence and resources from our education team.

Re-verification:

Nature Play Education Providers will need to complete re-verfication process every 2 years to maintain their position as a registered provider. Our team will make contact to let you know when re-verification is due.

Listing & Promotion Content	

There are two different sets of Primary School application criteria's:

'Nature Spaces and 'Outdoor Learning.

Refer to appropriate criteria list before beginning application.

Please Note:

- The online application form can be saved and resumed as needed.
- Once application evidence is compiled this application generally takes 5-10 minutes to complete.
- All documents submitted should labelled with relevant title E.g. 'Service Blurb Org Name'
- File types accepted: PDF, Word, JPEG, PNG or vector file.

Evidence Criteria

Primary School – Nature Spaces

For the criteria 1 and 2, evidence must be provided for all points.

1 | Service Operation

Evidence of being a Queensland Government Approved School

2 Policies and Procedures

- a) Nature Play Policy (could also be called Outdoor Play/Loose Parts Play or similar)
- b) Examples of other Policies that relate to Nature play, Risky play and Loose Parts
- c) Examples of Risk-Benefit Assessments/CARAs for nature play, risky play or natures loose parts etc Or any other documentation; Service documents and procedures relating to nature play/loose parts program

For the below criteria, evidence is to be provided for a selection of these points in each category. The evidence is assessed holistically and may cover a range of areas.

3 Whole Setting Approach Embedded to Provide Regular Nature Play Experiences for All Children

- a) Documentation of your nature/ loose parts play journey as a whole school/team (may be in newsletter, website, staff reflections etc)
- b) Documentation to evidence nature/loose parts play is across all age phases in your school, evidencing a 'whole school' approach
- c) Documentation of children's voices and feedback from children on their experiences about nature/loose parts play

For the below criteria, evidence is to be provided for a selection of these points in each category. The evidence is assessed holistically and may cover a range of areas.

3 Whole Setting Approach Embedded to Provide Regular Nature Play Experiences for All Children

- a) Documentation of your nature play/outdoor learning journey as a whole school/team (may be in newsletter, website, staff reflections etc)
- b) Documentation to evidence outdoor learning and nature/loose parts play is across all age phases in your school, evidencing a 'whole school' approach
- c) Documentation of children's voices and feedback from children on their experiences about outdoor learning and nature/loose parts play
- d) Minutes from staff meetings evidencing nature play and/or outdoor learning discussion and developments
- e) Examples of unit plans, a series of lesson plans, recording or reflecting tools that show evidence of regular (weekly) outdoor learning experiences across all ages.

- g) Documentation demonstrating how outdoor learning/nature play/loose parts has been linked to support your School Improvement Priority(s)
- h) Evidence of providing relevant extra-curricular activities/clubs linking to nature play/loose parts, e.g. Enviro Club, Bush Explorers Club, Gardening Club, Outdoor Engineering Club or Bug Club.





Photographs

As part of your application we need photo's to show off all the amazing things that showcase what you are doing, and what sets your organisation apart. Images that show off your spaces and embody the nature play mission work best.

- Provide 4-6 images at your school nature play outdoor areas and natural loose part resources used regularly
- Resolution: High (avoid pixelation)
- Recommended file type: Jpeg, PNG
- Recommended dimensions: Landscape / square (at least 800px)
- All photo's must be provided with appropriate consent from organisation and any persons or parent's of children pictured. As part of the application a consent declaration will need to be agreed to. through tariffs.

Video Clips (Optional)

As part of ongoing promotion of your services and venue, **if you so choose**, please provide two video clips. Video really shows the world what nature play is all about. so we recommend you provide engaging clips of what's happening at your school.


- Provide 2 x video clips of either nature play in action at your school (eg children doing nature play) or clips of your unique nature play space
- Length: 10secs 1minute
- Audio: No dialog/talking needed. Just organic sounds of activity in video.
- Recommended file type: Mp4, MOV
- Video Dimensions: Portrait/Vertical (1920x1080px)

- All video's must be provided with appropriate consent from organisation and any persons or parent's of children pictured. As part of the application a consent declaration will need to be agreed to.
- No editing necessary
- Please make sure video is stable/smooth (no shaking) and lit well (clear visibility)

About Your Service Blurb

Please provide about blurb on your school. Tone should be engaging and fun to entice audience to find out more about your service and nature play. Don't just copy everyone else, give it a personal touch!

Use the following headings to complete your blurb:

- Provide blurb Microsoft Word document
- 200-300 characters.
- Our School Short description about your school. Answer:
 - 'What's unique about your school?'

- Why Nature Play Short description about nature play at your school. Answer:
 - 'Why is nature play so important to your school?
 - 'What does nature play look like at your school?'

Updating Your Website Listing

If you need to make any changes to your online listing, or change your photo's please email marketing@natureplayqld.org.au.

- Do not provide amendments to blurb. Re-submit an entirely new blurb with changes included.
- Changes will be made to the online listing as quickly as possible from date of submission.
- If an education provider chooses not to update their listing annually, they may risk being featured in less Nature Play QLD social media posts.

Please note:

- Nature Play QLD will be in touch with you annually to request information changes and new photo's for your listing.
- Every two years Nature Play Education Providers need to go through a re-verification process, new photo's and information will also be requested at this time.







In submitting photos and video to Nature Play QLD, you are declaring that you have consent for these images and recordings to be used in accordance with the following guidelines:
